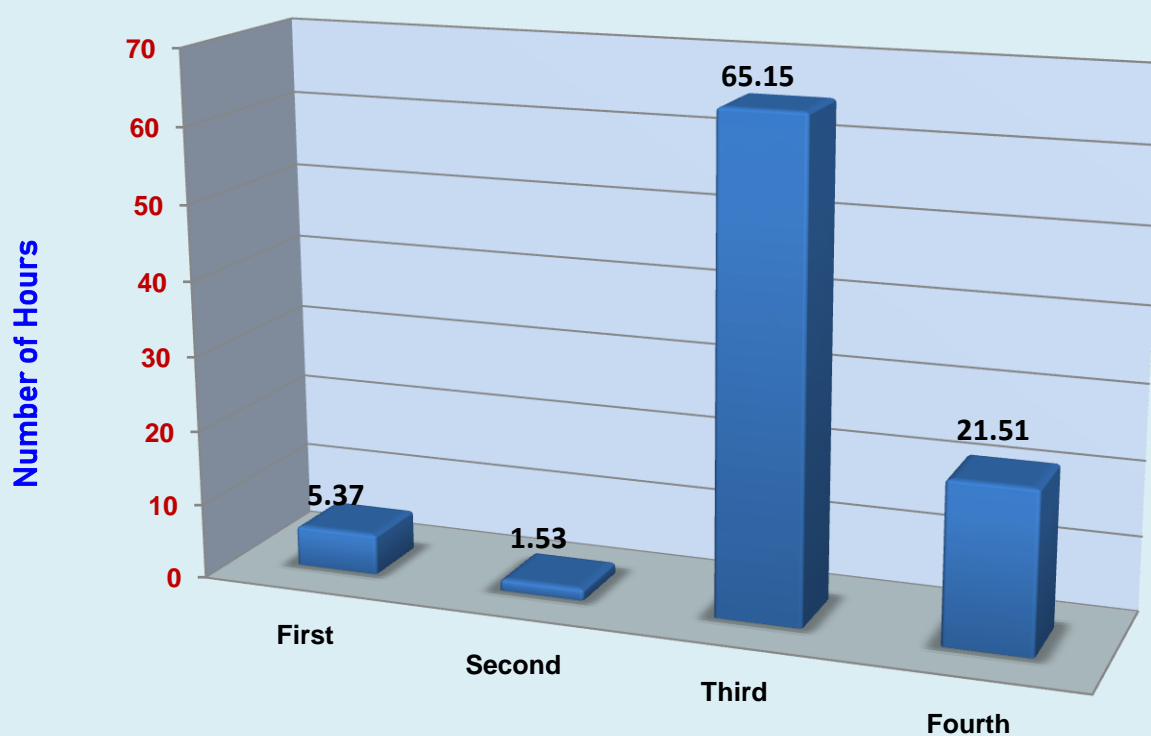

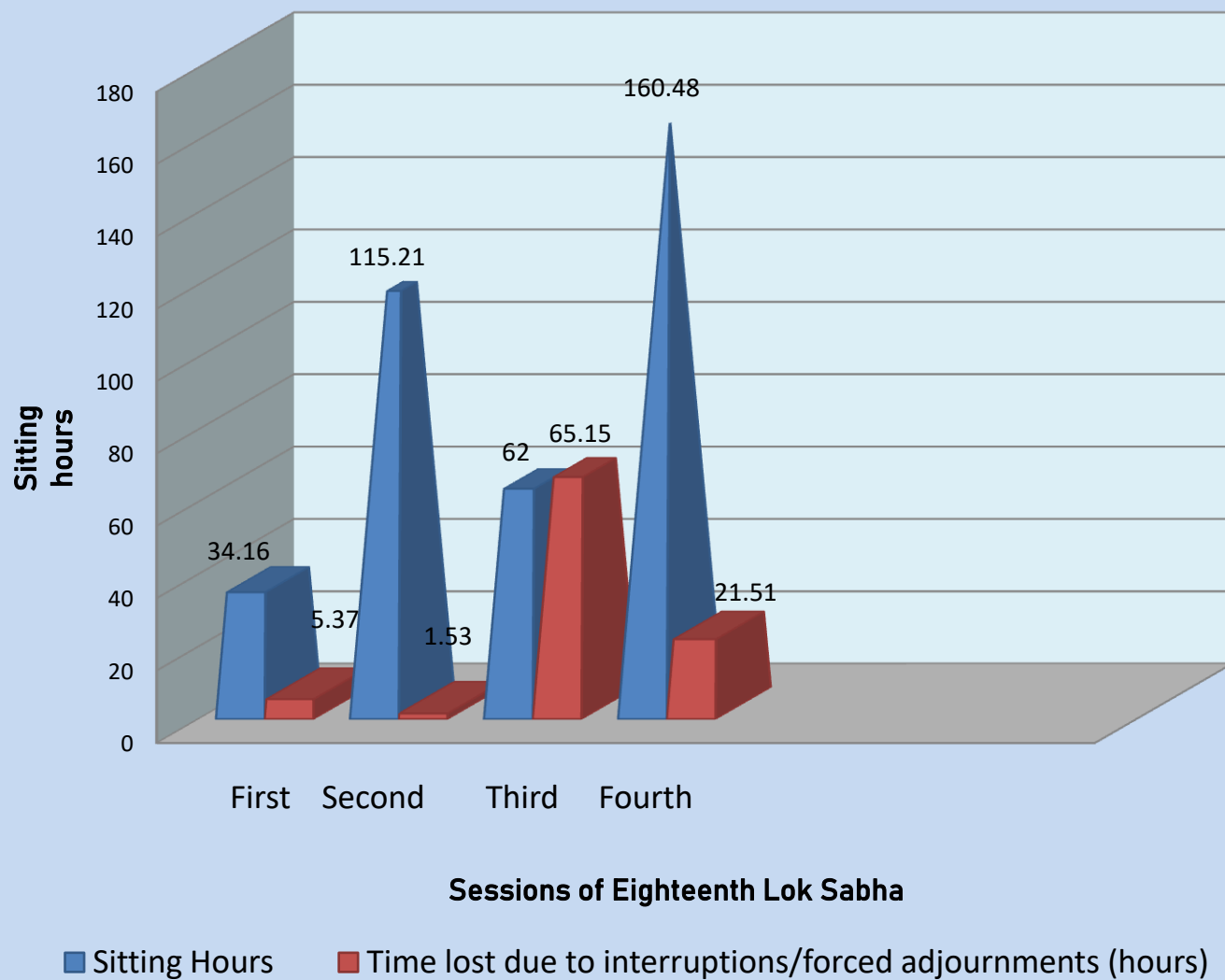

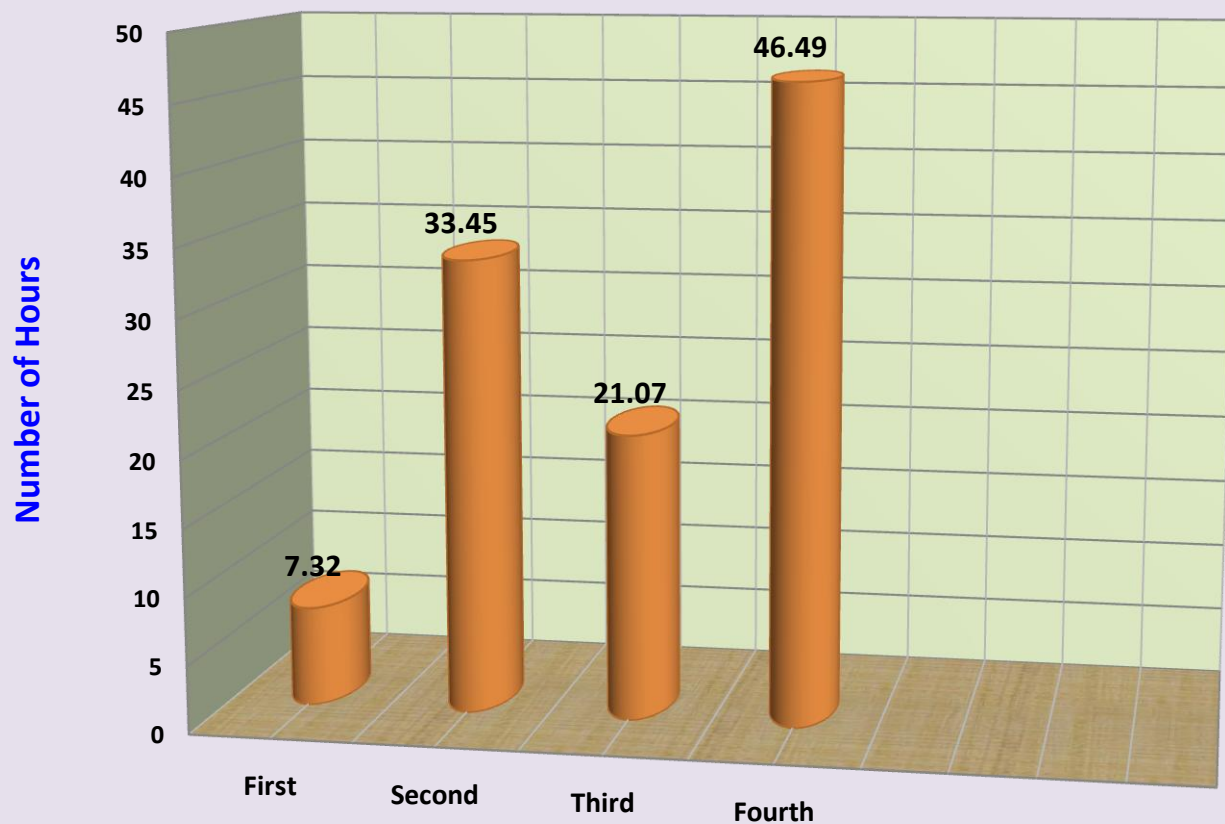
Sitting Hours and Time lost due to interruptions/forced adjournments

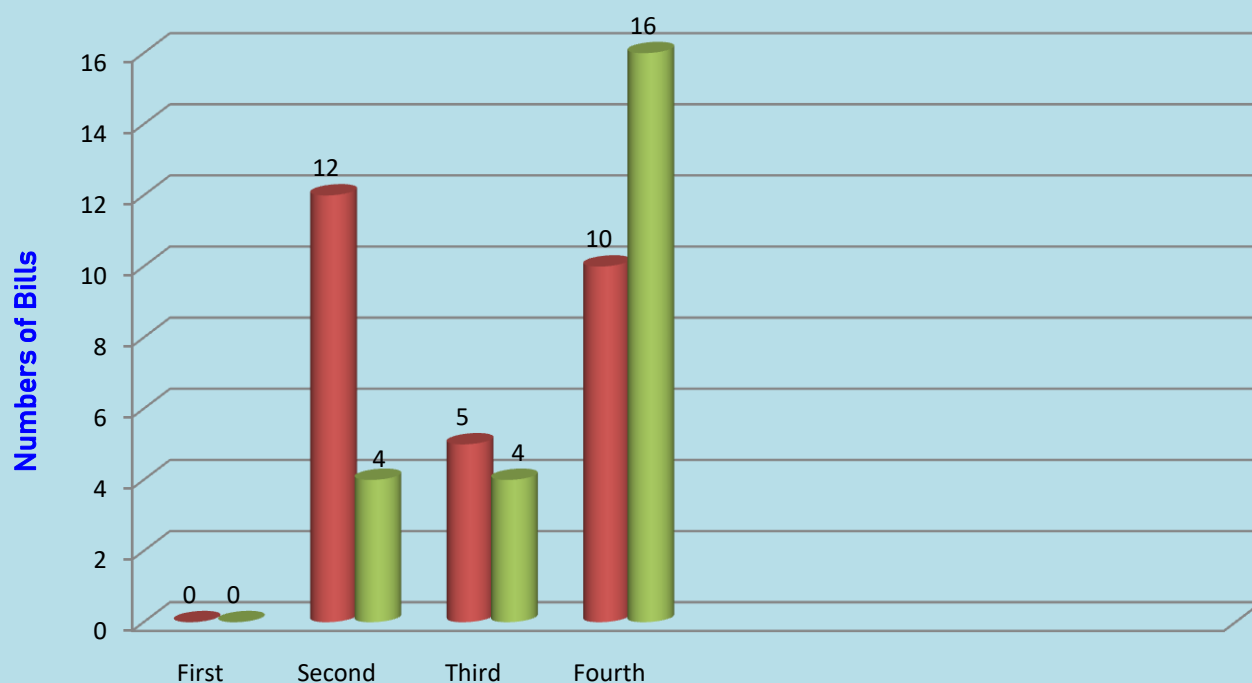

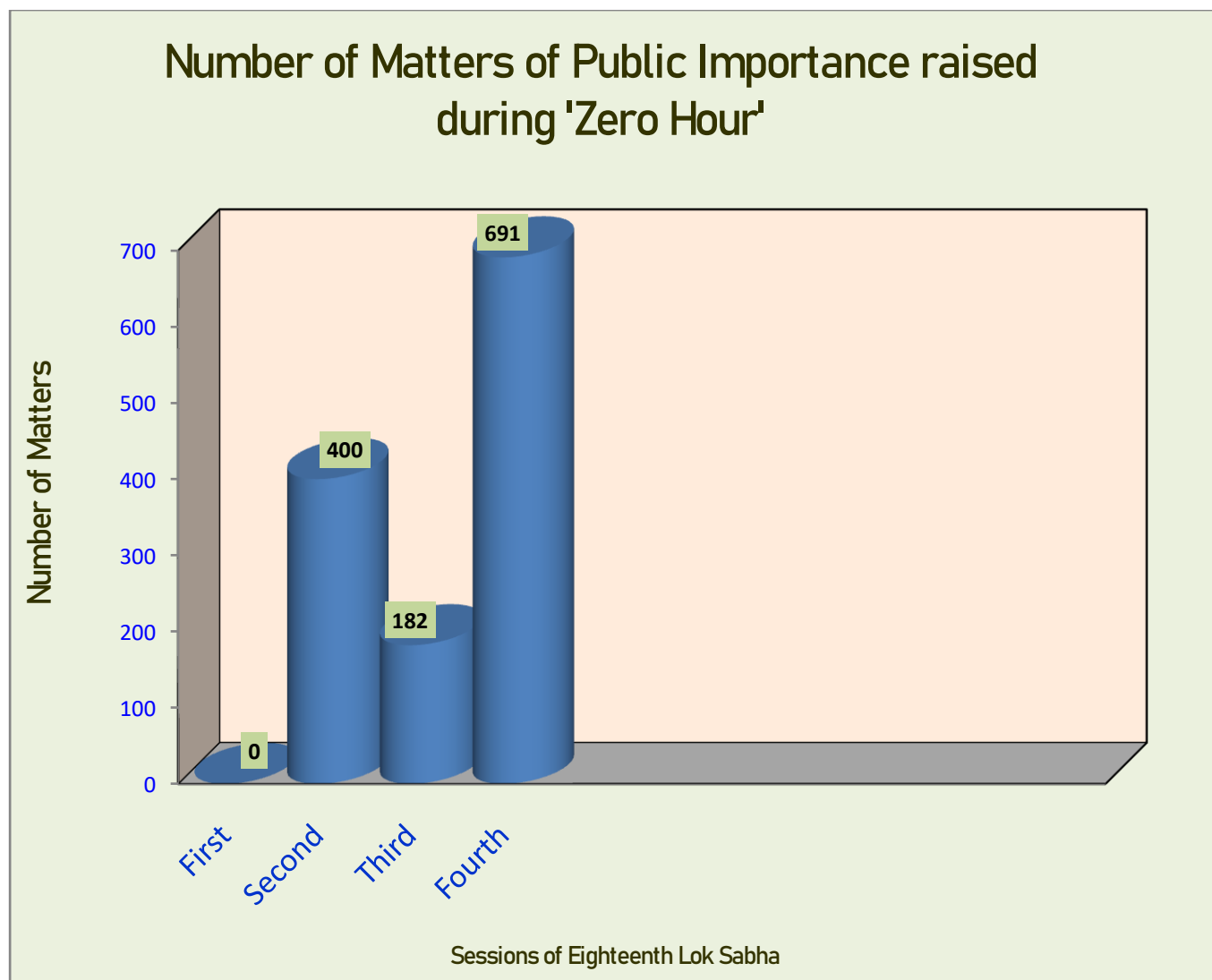

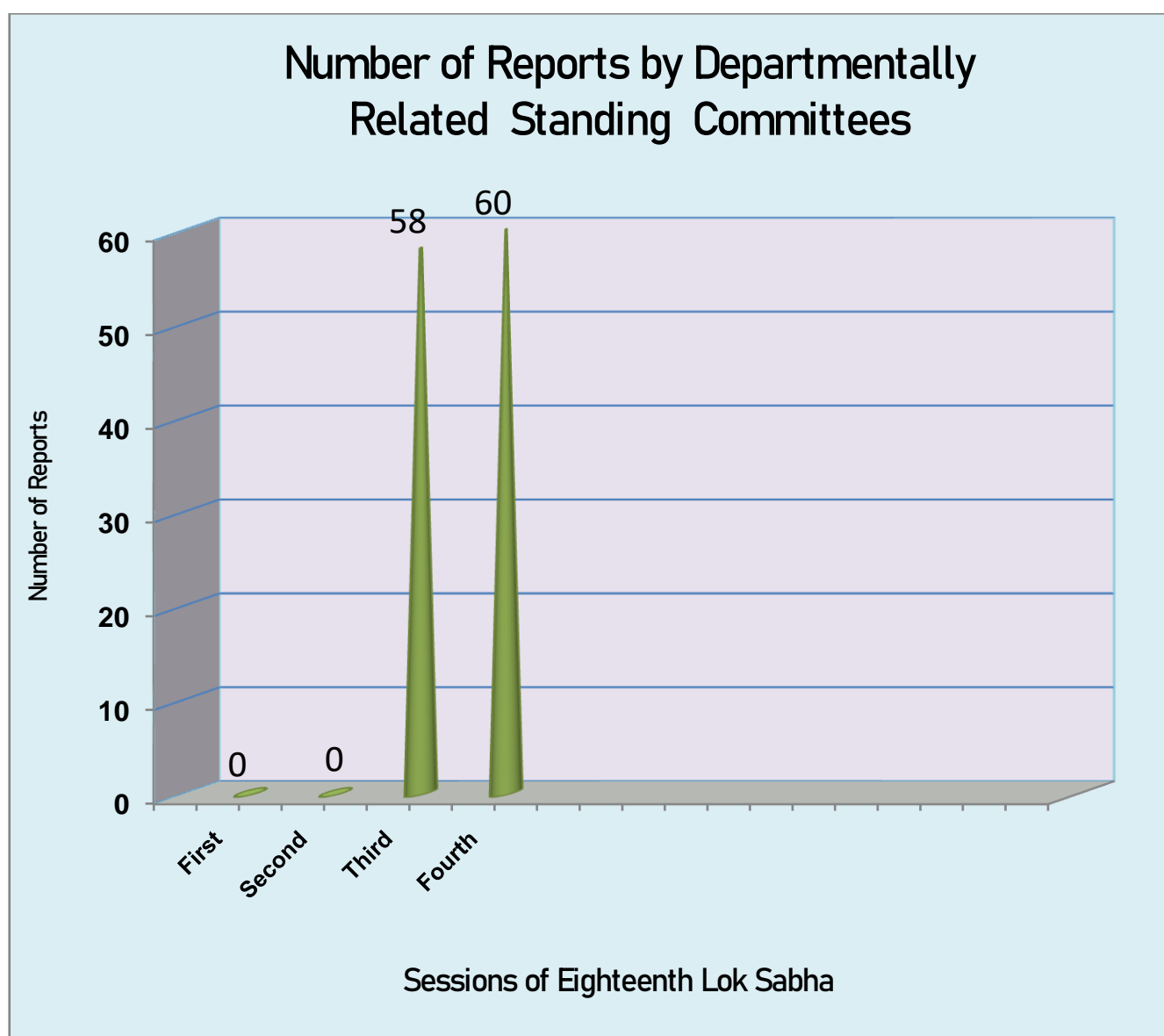

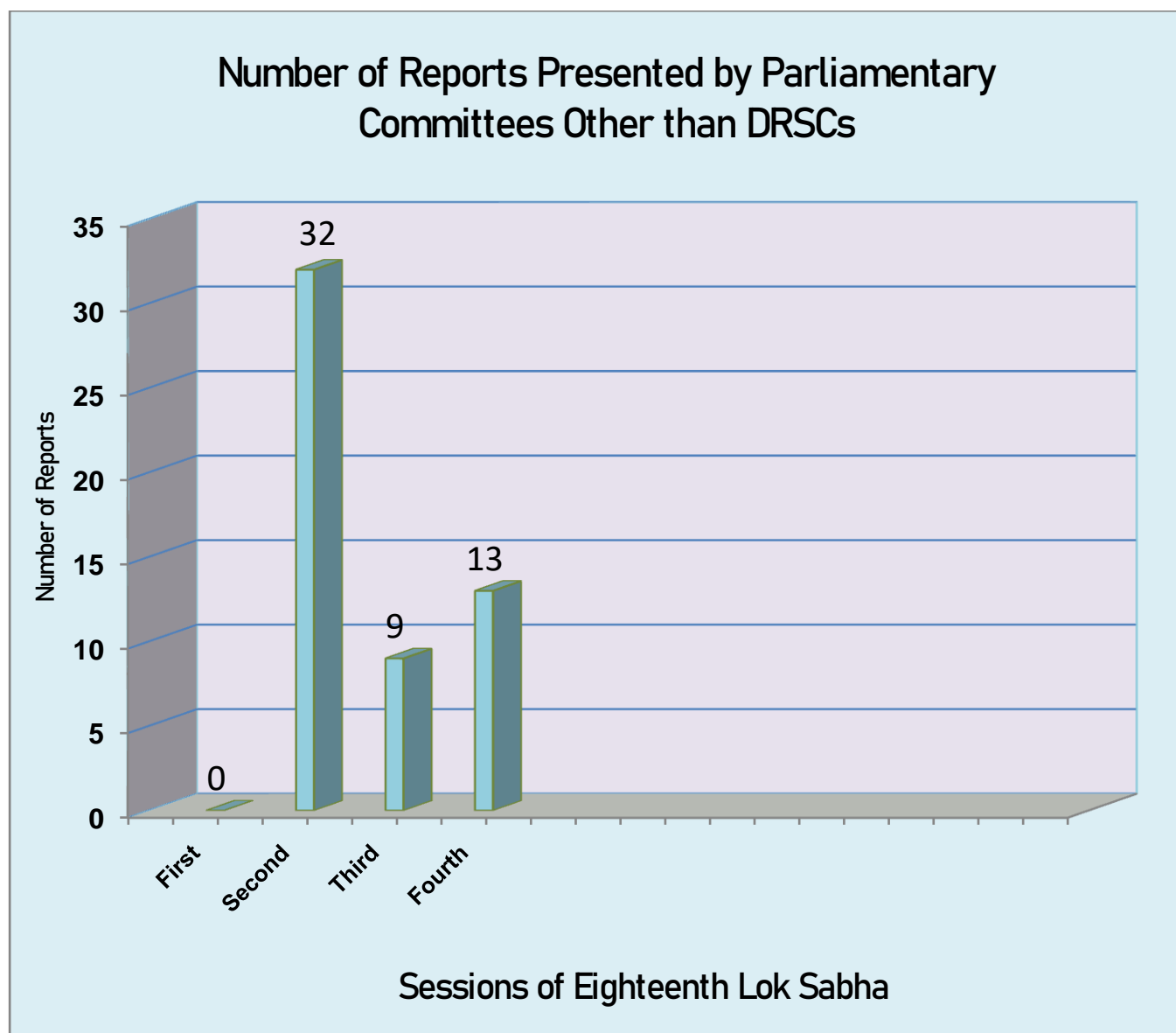

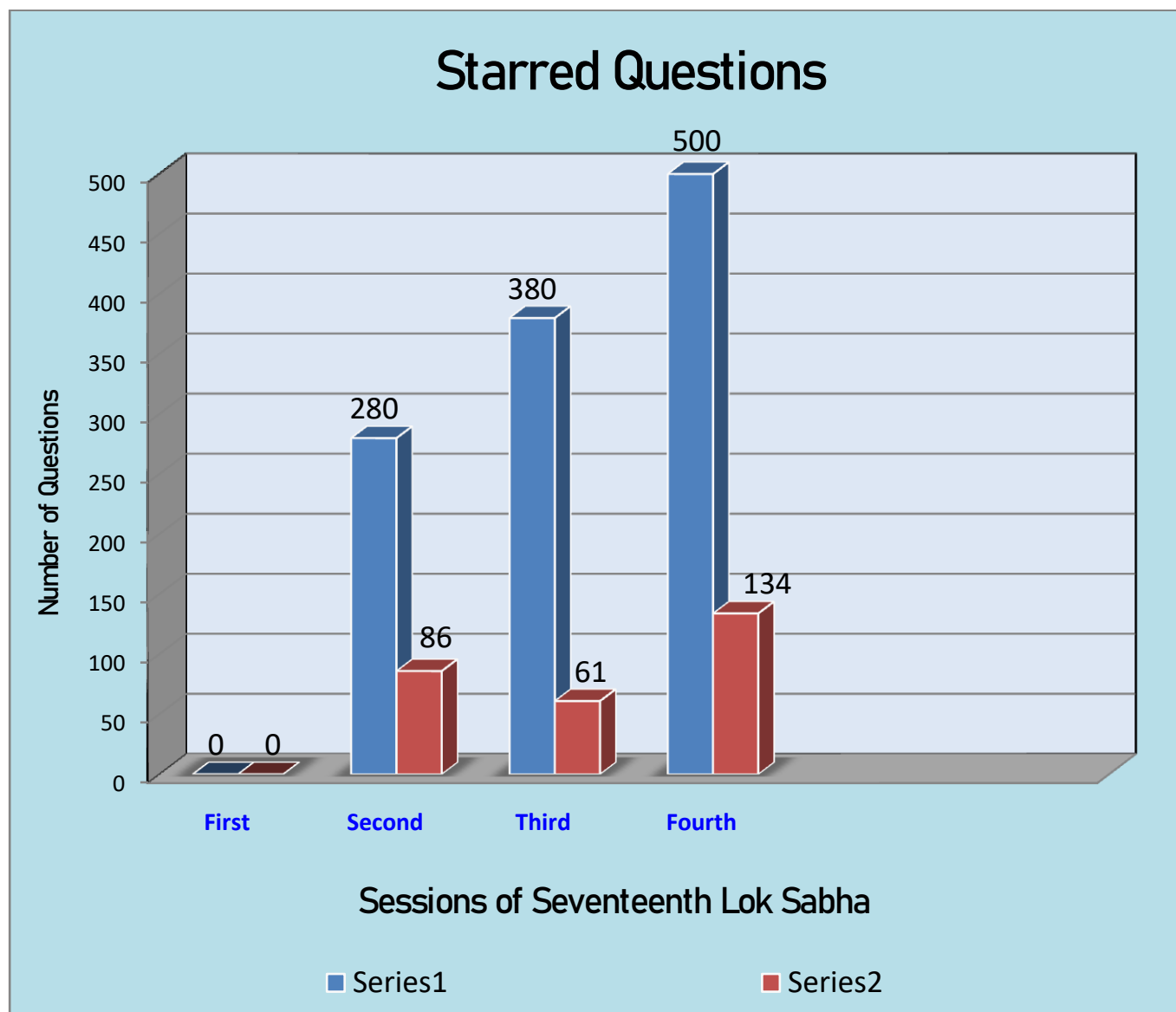

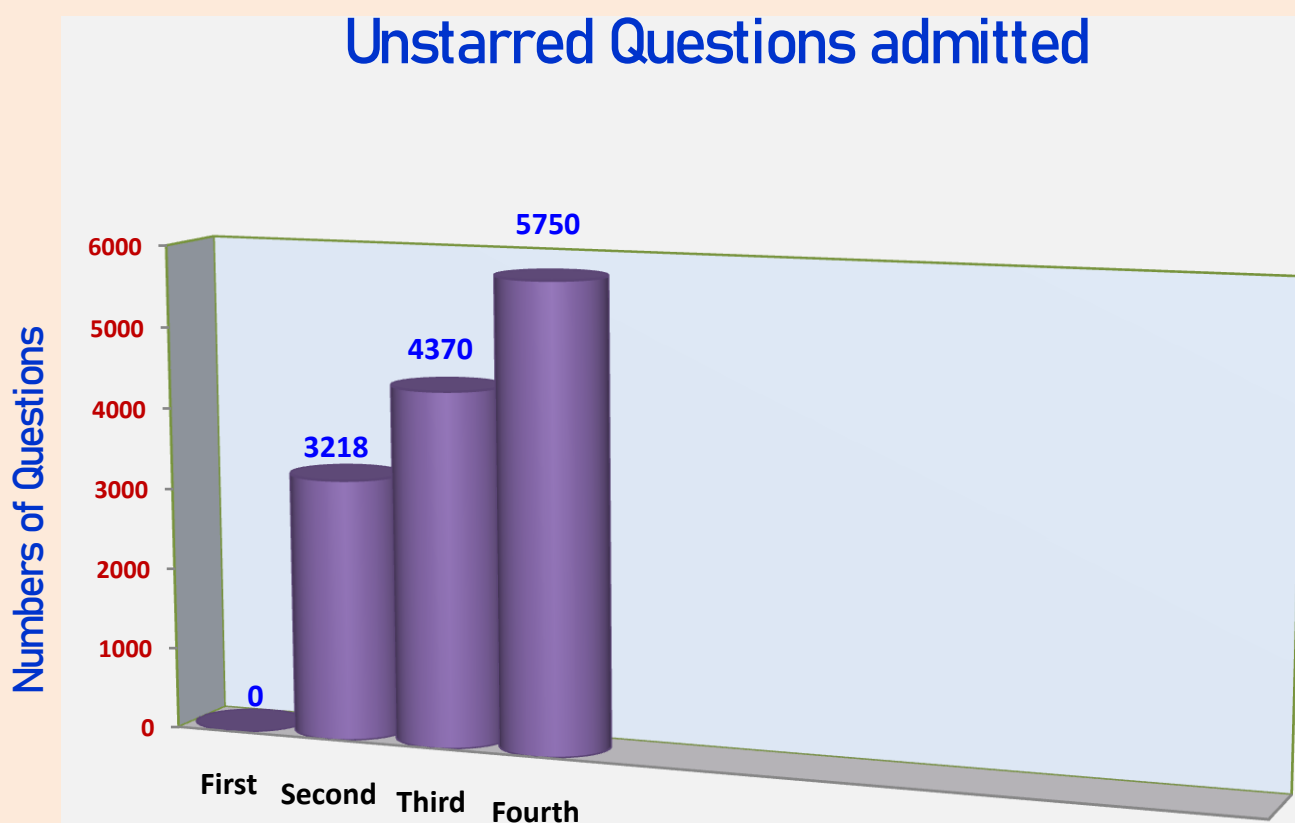
